Medically Fragile Waiver

1984 and started in 1985

- o Eligible for the waiver based off medical fragility regardless of family income
- Application can take 2-6 months

Already receiving Medicaid

- Services start once client meets criteria
- Family meets ongoing Medicaid criteria

Eligibility

Level of Care Assessment determines eligibility by medical fragility factors.

The client must also meet **developmental delay** criteria. Scoring factors:

Medications	Complex medical treatments
Medical care and supervision	Nutrition and feeding
Neurological	Family support challenges
Respiratory	Self care abilities





Mission: Medically Fragile Case Management Program (MFCMP), the Medically Fragile Waiver, and community services support families in their decision to care for their child who is medically fragile in their home.

- Nursing care
- Ongoing case management and skilled nursing care at home
- Environmental modification assist
- Medical equipment fund
